The Epsilon Epsilon Lambda (EEL) Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc., Waco, Texas, is sponsoring scholarships up to a total of \$1,000. These scholarships will be awarded to graduating high school students pursuing post-secondary education. Funds will be applied toward tuition and books for the academic session of the recipient's Freshman Fall or Spring Semester.

Eligibility & Criteria

To be eligible for the scholarship, applicants must follow all directions carefully and meet the following criteria:

- Must submit a completed application with all required materials
- Minimum overall GPA of 2.5 or equivalent to a (B) average
- Official transcript or letter verifying GPA and classification
- Verification of admission and/or acceptance to a post-secondary institution
- Three (3) letters of recommendation (one personal source, one teacher or institutional source, one community leader)
- One (1) to two (2) page essay stating career ambitions, goals, and why you should be awarded the scholarship

All applicants must be in good standing with their respective high school and/or newly admitted post-secondary institution. The deadline to submit the application and supporting documents is March 13, 2026 (postmarked). All recipients will be notified by April 17, 2026. Incomplete applications will be disqualified.

Ask a community member (mentor, teacher, coach, pastor, etc.) to write a brief letter of endorsement. If selected, this person will also introduce you at the scholarship celebration.

5. Optional: Resume or List of Activities

Include extracurriculars, leadership roles, or volunteer work.
